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Project	Expected Outcome	Academic Qtr.
Neighborhood Revitalization Planning	This project will help the City of Redmond set up a template for better understanding the viability and function of its neighborhoods. Revitalization of Redmond's neighborhoods is the ultimate goal with analysis of this first neighborhood.	Fall
Redmond Walkability	Development of geospatial data layers related to walkability based on census data, employment data, and information provided by the City of Redmond. Analysis of walkability and 'gaps' or areas for improvement.	Fall
Multi-Way Boulevard for Redmond	Design site analysis maps of study area detailing issues. Identify parcels most likely to be developed/redeveloped in next 20 years.	Fall
South US 97 Corridor Improvement	Develop a landscaping plan for the multi-way boulevard concept, taking into account the highway environment, the local business needs and the need to establish this facility as a gateway for the City of Redmond.	Fall
Multi-sports Complex Feasibility Anal	This project would entail an overall feasibility study for Redmond to invest in a sports complex, analyzing potential use, return on investment, researching recreational use and trends to identify specific facilities and fields needed for a successful complex.	Spring/Winter
Art Moderne MPD	This project focuses on the development of a National Register Multiple Property Listing nomination for Art Moderne properties in Redmond.	Spring
Outreach to Minority Communities	This project will build on ways to increase outreach and enhance and build community among all city residents. This will contribute to the enhancement of civic engagement and communication to effectively reach Redmond's Latino community.	Spring

Downtown Market Analysis	This project will update a 2005 marketing analysis by examining a primary market area and secondary market area, utilizing data sets and intercept consumer surveys.	Winter
